






ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY







5 - DAY STRUCTURE

BEST HSC FOR ME


- Preliminary and HSC students attend school 5 days a week at their respective campuses

- •The overarching theme of this change is to improve learning outcomes for students and better prepare our learners for post-school transitions.







FUTURE DIRECTIONS PROCESS



COURSE SELECTION CONSIDERATIONS

In 2022, the Minister for Education announced a raft of HSC reforms as part of the Curriculum Reform program, which included removing classifications for ATAR courses. **Previously, only 2 units of a Category B courses could contribute to the ATAR.**

The announcement came after a review of the VET sector identified current HSC and ATAR arrangements as a barrier to developing a pipeline of job-ready high school graduates. The Joint ATAR Reform Advisory Committee also recommended the removal of HSC course categories for the calculation of the ATAR.

This piece of reform aims to lift the perceived value of vocational studies and will give students the opportunity to study more courses they are interested in and passionate about.

The change will be in place from the 2025 HSC.


MIMMUM STANDARDS


- To be eligible for a HSC students need to demonstrate they have met a minimum standard in literacy and numeracy.
- Students will have several opportunities to meet the HSC minimum standard. This includes six opportunities each year from Year 10 up to five years after starting their first HSC course.
- Students will show they meet the HSC minimum standard by passing online tests of basic literacy and numeracy skills.



DISABILITY PROVISIONS

- Students doing their Higher School Certificate (HSC) may need disability provisions for:
- a permanent condition, such as cerebral palsy or vision impairment
- a temporary condition, such as a broken arm, or
- an intermittent condition, such as back pain when sitting for long periods.
 Schools are responsible for adjustments in school-based assessment tasks. NESA determines disability provisions for HSC exams.
- More than 10,000 HSC students apply for provisions each year.






HSC PATTERN OF STUDY










- The HSC is a credential and the highest level of attainment that secondary school students can achieve in NSW.
- The HSC mark for each course, which is calculated by NESA, shows your performance in the exam and assessments for that course.
- The HSC mark reflects the standard you achieved.






- Preliminary Course (Year 11: Terms 1-3)
- HSC Course (Year 11: Term 4; Year 12: Terms 1-3)
- AT LEAST 12 units in Year 11
- AT LEAST 10 units in Year 12
- English is compulsory
- Students must satisfactorily complete the Preliminary course before commencing the HSC in that course.








SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COURSE

Students must:

- follow the course developed or endorsed by NESA
- apply themselves with diligence and sustained effort to the set task and experiences provided in the course by the school; and
- achieve some or all of the course outcomes


VET Board Developed Courses require students to complete mandatory work placement.



SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COURSE

Students must:

- complete HSC assessment tasks that contribute in excess of
 50 per cent of available marks in courses where internal assessment marks are submitted; and
- sit for and make a **serious attempt** at any requisite Higher School Certificate examinations for a course




Internal school based assessment 50%












ATAR

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR):


- is for students wishing to gain a place at a university
- is calculated by the University Admissions Centre (UAC)
- is a rank **NOT** a mark, shows your position or ranking compared to other students in NSW and takes into account your achievement in the best 10 units of your HSC courses.
- provides information about how a student performs overall in relation to other students.
- Its only purpose is to help universities select students for courses






ATAR

- There are rules about what courses you can choose
- A combination of the HSC examination mark and the school assessment mark will result in your HSC grade

 of the HSC will be discussed in the subject selection interviews –
 Maximum 1 BEC course in Year 11 which cannot count towards
 ATAR in Year 12









ΔTAR

 Assistance on applications for students ATAR, early entry applications and general advice on university pathways will be provided to students in Year 11 from their Careers Advisers.







MYTHS

XMYTH: Students who are approved for Disability Provisions receive extra HSC marks.







MYTHS

X MYTH: My HSC marks and ATAR will be pulled down by the performance of other classmates who don't perforn well.







SBAT


- Combine HSC, part-time paid work and structured workbased training delivered by a Registered Training Organisation e.g., school, TAFE
- Industry Based Learning
- Board Endorsed Status (cannot count to ATAR)
- Gives HSC unit credit for the 'on-the-job' component of SBATs





- Students enter an approved School-Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship contract and are also entered for the appropriate VET course(s)
- If you are considering this, ensure you have a discussion with our campus Careers Advisers this evening in the Panorama Room






SUBJECT CHOICES


- Think about what you like, what you are good at, what you think you may want to do post-school and do what you can to achieve your best result in each course.


